

OVERCOMING DEPRESSION



"Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went on a day's journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die."

(1 Kings 19:3-4)

Life will happen. Situations and circumstances draining our last hope and faith in God can pop up without prior notice. But what do you do during those times? Do you choose to trust God and let Him take full control or you opt tostay down?

Depression is a state/a place you find yourself. There's a sense of helplessness, and it tends to limit your potential, just like Elijah, a powerful prophet who called down fire, at a point isolated himself and called for death because of a threat from Jezebel.

When you're depressed, it's difficult to believe things can get better because it has a way of magnifying what's wrong and leaving no space to see what's right. It changes you, you become irritable and a shadow of yourself.

Some of the signs that you might be in a depressed state are fear, anxiety, helplessness and low self-esteem. You find it difficult to try again. Taking steps to raise funds for business becomes difficult because you've experienced too many rejections. Some other signs are not wanting to apply for jobs any longer because of all the failure experienced thus far. Some run from love and isolate themselves because of past heartbreaks. That's what depression can do. (Job 19:2).

If you're in that state, the first step is to admit it because whatever you cannot admit, you can't change. The same way your physical body can be sick, so also, the soul can be sick, it's called and it should be treated likewise. The same way you get help when you're sick in the body, you should get help, to get healing when you're depressed and not try to conceal it.

Find a community of people who you can talk to, join a small group and share whatever it is you're going through. Do not isolate. Isolation is one of the biggest causes of depression. You cannot be connected to relationships and feel depressed, because the relationships will help pull you up when you're down.

In those low moments, stay grounded. As long as your roots are in the ground, you will bud again. When things happen, they knock you out completely because you don't have roots. To stay grounded, put roots in the word of God. There's something about God's word that soothes the weary and depressed soul. Let the water of God's word fill every dry aspect of your life.

"Even a tree has more hope! If it is cut down, it will sprout again and grow new branches. Though its roots have grown old in the earth and its stump decays, at the scent of water it will bud and sprout again like a new seedling." **Job 14:7-9.**

Wayre Cordeiro in his book "The Dream releaser", has an amazing story of how he decided to buy a cage containing a little bird in Japan for about 100 Yen. But just while he was about to go, the vendor called him back and made one of the most profound statements I will never forget he said in a Japanese dialect "SUMIMASEN" which implies "Don't forget: bring back the cage when finished!" in confusion Wayne Cordeiro said, "bring back the cage? I am not planning to eat it. It's going to be my new pet. Without a cage, how do you expect me to get it home?" "Oh", replied the vendor, "you no understand. Bird not to take home. You take the bird to the edge and release. So can fly free", reluctantly and out of fear, he took the cage to the nearby valley and "tapped the cage" until the little bird was able to find the exit point and flew out into the skies where it belongs.

Jesus has paid the "vendor" (Satan) the full price for the release of mankind but will require you and I to go around tapping their cages and enforcing their release. Many have their potentials, talents, gifting and calling locked up in the cages of ignorance, deception, tradition and even their profession hence require you and I to help them tap the "cage" until their destinies begin to find expression on the earth. HELPING HURTING PEOPLE



"14 And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick."

(Matthew 14:14)

ave you ever asked the question "why do bad things happen in the world?" It would surprise you to know that it is not always the work of Satan hunting you directly. In most cases, it could be a continued effect of the fall e.g., as we grow older, we age. Another reason is the poor choices we make. A third reason is circumstances beyond our control, like where we were born. To be a part of the solution, we must learn to develop compassion.

In **Luke 10: 30-37**, a Levite, a Priest, and a Samaritan pass by a badly wounded man, and each acted differently. There are differences between compassion, pity and empathy: compassion sees a hopeless event and takes action, empathy and pity see and discuss or mope over it. As spiritual people, we may be aware of a bad situation and feel bad or sorry about it, but this does not guarantee that we will do anything about it.

According to the scripture, Jesus saw and was moved to do something. Compassion is important because it triggers the power of God. We have to cultivate the heart of compassion. It is difficult for God to use a man that is not compassionate, because the needs of the people can't get his attention. Where your compassion is, is where God can use you.

How many times do we see the homeless, the naked, or even drug addicts and quickly forget that there just might be something that could come from us, which would be an answer to their prayers for the day. We may have excess clothes but, rather than give somebody wearing the same outfit everyday we'd rather keep stacking up. The Priest in the earlier scripture came by that way and looked away. Where

is your heart of compassion?

For God to do something, He has to look for people, especially those with compassion in that area. If it is in your heart, God will put it in your hands. God trusts compassionate people. God may bring you around a family in danger of divorce, hoping that you will pray and do what you can according to His wisdom. Do you have an idea of the statistics of jobless people? When the compassion of God grips the soul of an individual, God can capture such an individual's attention quickly, even in matters that concern nations. You can always start from somewhere.

A self-centered life is empty in the middle.

How do I become compassionate?

- ·Pay attention to others (you may care to know why a coworker does not smell too good).
- ·Develop a solution mentality; tell yourself, "I am God's force for good in the economy".
- ·Be involved; be a part of the solution (move to see a change. Join outreaches. In a world that is determined to phase Christ out of the school systems, no more Bible knowledge, LGBT in Disney cartoons, and divorced parents who don't go to church it would be a joy to bring Christ to the children).
- ·Take action (as simple as giving out clothes you don't use, not bad ones; or praying for and with disturbed people.
- ·Preaching Christ. Some people sleep around to gain acceptance; some load on drugs just to get high and forget their sorrows.
- Remember, that the more you help others, the more help comes to you to help others even more. **Matthew** 5.7



EXPERIENCING THE POWER OF GOD



And when Rachel saw that she bare Jacob no children, Rachel envied her sister; and said unto Jacob, Give me children, or else I die."

(Genesis 30:1)

ne of the frustrating experiences as a believer is to know that God can do something, yet not see results. Many believers are faced with this issue. How do you practically experience the power of God, so that it brings the change you desire as a person? Un-met expectations (marriage, finances, a job, an illness, a never-leaving addiction, etc) can lead you to envy other believers who seem to have things working: like Rachel in the above scripture.

Understand first, that there is a difference between fact and truth. If the doctor says anyone who contact's a certain kind of illness will die, according to his medical profession, it's a fact; but is that the Truth? No, not according to God's Word. Could it be where your feelings of hopelessness are stemming from, that you have accepted the fact as the Truth? In fact, "facts" are always changing.

For instance, at some point in the past, COVID was said not to have a cure. Have they found a cure? Yes. Facts change, but the Truth always stays the same. Facts are not final verdicts (Mk 10:2). If you want to experience the power of God, you must be able to stretch your faith to the Truth, beyond the fact.

While we talk about the logical side of things, there's also the spiritual side. You keep talking about what the doctor said, instead, talk about the power to reverse what the doctor said. You keep telling God about your mountain; God already knows, start talking to your mountain about the Living God. There are no powerless Christians. There are only Christians that forget who they are because they are overwhelmed by the issues of life (Acts 1:8). The Holy Ghost came to make you a proof producer (Exo 8:16-19).

The story was told of a Christian guy who had a problem and went to see a witch doctor. The doctor tells him to stay in the room where he'll be visited by a snake or some animal. He is to wrestle with the snake and either kill it or get killed. He soon realizes he is losing ground to the snake and starts speaking in tongues. The snake is paralyzed to the dismay of the witch doctor who says: 'you have this kind of power and you come here?'. Who are the people around you? Are they the ones who encourage you to cut corners? That's why people begin to take alternatives that ruin them.

How do I experience the power of God? **Psalms 63** teaches us that we have to be hungry. You can't be okay just showing up in church on Sundays. Thirst is a currency. As a believer, the power you carry needs to be activated **(Ps 82:6).** You cannot live your life jumping from prophet to prophet. Time is an investment for spiritual things. Hunger reflects in separation. Hunger reflects sacrifice. Also, power flows to the lovers of God. Do you really love God, or do you just want Him to do something for you? **Jn 4:10, 2Chro 1:11,12**

Finally, our generosity activates the law of sowing and reaping and creates a pathway for us to be blessed by God and helped by other people. **Proverbs 11:25** says "The generous soul will be made rich, and he who waters will also be watered himself."

God wants to bless and increase you, so that through you the world will be blessed. Are you going to partner with Him through your generosity, or will find an excuse not to be a giver?

THE REWARD OF GENEROSITY





Give and it shall be given unto you: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you. (Luke 6:38)

hen God asks us to do something, we must remember that although we may be doing it for Him, we are ultimately the biggest beneficiaries of our obedience. A case in point is our generosity. There are numerous examples in the scriptures where God instructs us to live generous lives. In today's devotional, we will consider what some of the rewards of generosity are.

- 1. Giving results in receiving: Jesus himself said in **Luke 6:38**, "Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal [measure]it shall be measured to you again." The bible also teaches in **2 Corinthians 9:6** that the quality of our giving is tied to the quality of our harvest.
- 2. Giving adds to your account: People often see giving as something that takes away from them, but that's an inaccurate perspective. In **Philippians 4:17**, we see that our giving actually results in a credit to our spiritual account.
- 3. Giving helps us access divine blessings: When we respond in generosity to God, we position ourselves to access His blessings on earth. In **Malachi 3**, God promises us that when we give, He will open the windows of heaven over us. Do you want to access God's blessings for your life? Make a choice to live a generous life.
- 4. Giving increases our faith. Our generosity is a proof of our trust in God. The more you trust God, the more you will give. And the more you give, the more you learn to trust God that you will have enough left over for your own needs. Our trusting God is so big in God's mind that our finances are the only place He allows us to test Him, as seen in **Malachi 3:10.**
- 5. Our generosity results in thanksgiving and praise. God doesn't want to bring you a financial blessing just so you can sit on a fat bank account and gloat about what you have. He wants you to be generous with others, and as you do so, their thanksgiving will go up to God on your behalf. Is your wealth a source of thanksgiving to the Lord? If not, then you're not using your finances correctly.

God wants to bless so many of His children, but until we partner with Him through our generosity, we may find ourselves living sub-optimal lives.

HOW TO USE THE NAME JESUS



Acts 19:11-15 (KJV)

Some people often wonder if the name of Jesus works. They assert that despite praying in Jesus' name, they received no result. Then they reach a conclusion, "Does the name really work?". There are instances in the bible where people used the name of Jesus and it didn't work, see (Acts 19:11-15 KJV). You might be curious to know why the name of Jesus didn't work; the explanation is that we do not know how to use the name.

hilippians 2:9-10) – talks about the name of Jesus as an AUTHORITY. The problem is that we keep saying the name, but the power is not in saying the name, the power is standing in the authority of what the name means.

Does the name work? (Acts 3:16) The name works, but do you know how to use it? Do you know the authority behind the name of Jesus?

What does the name mean to you? What is the name of Jesus? The name of Jesus is not talking about J-E-S-U-S; rather it refers to the authority of Jesus. You don't assume authority; authority comes by knowledge. Most Christians are unable to function in the name of Jesus because they do not know better. They don't know what the name means. Therefore, it is important for you to learn about the authority of Jesus.

Praying in the name of Jesus means, the authority Jesus Christ has given to us. So, we go to the Father in the authority of Jesus (**John 14:6**). Praying through Jesus and praying in the name of Jesus are two different things. We are not asked to pray through Jesus, we are asked to pray in the name (in the authority) of Jesus.

Where is the power in the name of Jesus? (Micah 4:5) The Power in the name of Jesus is understanding His authority. When you don't know this, you can't take authority because authority is based on knowledge. Many Christians do not use the name of Jesus effectively and they continue to do what others do because they have not studied for themselves, and they wonder why it's not working.

Why is there authority in His name?

The name of Jesus was obtained in three ways. When you understand how the name was gotten, you can understand the authority that comes with it.

- **1.** Jesus' name is an inheritance of the Father. The name is powerful because it is the name of God (Hebrews 1:4 KJV)
- 2. The name of Jesus is powerful because it is superior to every other authority (Ephesians 1:16-21 KJV)

3. The na

me was obtained by conquest. Conquest means Jesus defeated Satan. The name is higher because He can and He has dealt with them. (Colossians 2:15 KJV) "And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it".

How does the name of Jesus work?

1. By understanding the authority in the name. You may ask: "How do I understand authority?" Authority is not assumed, you read and study, because the more you know the authority, you can stand in it.

2. Through Faith in His name

What will you do with the name today? It's like an debit card that has been given to you. You have a power of attorney to the name. With the name, you can command, you can declare, you can release.

THE GREATEST GIFT OF ALL



"For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end." (Jeremiah 29:1)

A lot of us are generous. We give gifts to people we love. The size of the giftwe give and the gift itself is dependent on how weighty the recipient is. Gifts can be a measure of the value we place on an individual. For instance, if we are to give gifts to the president of any organization we may belong to, we would certainly not hand him a small denomination in the local currency.

Christmas is symbolically for gift-giving. It started because someone chose to give a gift. The gift of Jesus for the salvation, redemption, and reinstatement of man to where he was meant to be originally. It has led to this culture of gift giving. Think about the things that are of great value to you (son, daughter, car, houses, phone). Consider parting with them as a measure of your love to someone else, and this person not needing to do anything to earn it. That's what God did! God took what He considered most precious, and gave it as a gift; and that gift remains the single most important gift anyone could ever give or receive.

The gift of Jesus is an endless gift. It guarantees access to endless blessings. You access salvation through Jesus. Salvation can be likened to a premium subscription which gives you all the features of a software. Unhindered access to such means everything you could ever need in this world has been taken care of - children, finance, healing, prosperity in your soul, a life partner, etc.

In salvation, you experience freedom from sin (Rom 8:1). A lot of Christians lack conviction about the gift of Jesus they have received, and it's a pointer that their gift is still unwrapped. We can't accept a gift and abandon it never truly knowing what is inside. You have to enter a relationship with Jesus that would allow you to know Him, not just about Him! Knowing Jesus is about paying attention to Him (which means spending time with Him), and experiencing Him. Do you know Jesus? If you know Jesus only as a carpenter, all you will get would be furniture! Wrong teachings is another reason that people don't know Jesus.

How do we access God's gift?

- 1. By being born again (believe what Jesus did for you. Receive Jesus).
- 2. Knowledge (aim to know Him personally, and what He did for you on the cross).
- 3. Faith (God says the Just shall live by faith in this world. For instance, only the people that believe God answers prayers see God answer prayers). Unwrap your gift!

THE CHRISTIAN AND THE WORD OF GOD



Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needed not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

(2 Timothy 2:15) (KJV).

Be intentional about studying the bible, and your spiritual life will take off. If there is anything you should not leave to chance for the sake of your spiritual well-being, it is the quantity and quality of time spent digging the scriptures. In a world where everything seems to be fast and rising, many Christians have left the studying of their bible to chance, to Sunday or weekly service. Christians like that would only end up becoming spiritually malnourished. To study your bible effectively is to obey a biblical commandment, and to do otherwise because of whatsoever excuse is to disobey that command. Just as you need physical food on a daily basis to sustain the flesh, a Christian needs enough of the word of God to sustain the spirit daily.

Do you know that no matter how busy a man gets during the day, he still finds time to eat? Why? Because the body needs the food to continue. Such is the place of studying God's word daily to keep our spirit man alert and to hear from God. Thy words were found, and I did eat them (Jer. 15:16a). You must realize that it takes a hunger for God's word, not just sermons, for a man to be able to come to a place of studying the bible effectively. You must desire to know the mind of God directly. What is God's perspective on issues of life? The bible offers every detail of it. The hunger for God's word will make studying the word not a boring and ritualistic exercise as a Christian, but an avenue to hear God speak to you directly. If you are finding it hard to settle and find time for your bible, pray to God to increase your hunger for His word. This is only for those that sincerely want to improve in their bible study life. The psalmist says a broken and a contrite heart the Lord will not despise (Psalm 51:17). 119:11).

And be not conformed to this world; but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind; that ye may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God (Romans 12:2).

When you study your bible, your mind gets renewed which breeds transformation into more of Christ's stature. Be encouraged to set out a time daily on God's word, preferably during the early hours of the day or at night, please don't confuse this with morning devotion. It can be incorporated into morning devotion, but it must involve the whole of your heart, with the bible like a student to his books. You can get a journal and a pen to note down bible scriptures. Write out striking scriptures, lessons and directions received from studying the bible. You can assist your study with bible study outlines or guides from church. Remember it is bible study, not bible reading. Studying will involve comparing scriptures, memorizing scriptures, understanding scriptures and resolving to apply the lessons learnt to one's life which is the major essence of studying. The word of God is quick and sharper than any two-edged sword, it reveals itself to you like a man beholds a mirror. It is your sword against the devil. Remember how Jesus defeated the temptation from Satan? He didn't negotiate, he gave the devil scriptures and that was all (Matt. 4:1-11). Don't be without a Word when you face temptation from the devil. But how will you offer what you haven't filled yourself with? Your word have I hid in my heart that I shall not sin against thee (Psalm 119:11).

TRANSFORMATION BY HIS WORD



For a good tree bringeth not forth corrupt fruit; neither doth a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit. 44. For every tree is known by his own fruit. For of thorns men do not gather figs, nor of a bramble bush gather they grapes. 45. A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh."

(Luke 6:43-45)

The focus of this topic is on "How God changes us by the word". We will be examining the word, the seed (what it can do) and the need to take care of your hearts and emotions.

Luke 6:43-45 simply tells us that the results we have in our lives are functions of what's happening in our hearts.

For example: You may be believing God for a job, but what you say about it is what you believe. What is the state of your heart?

The Word of God is a "seed" and we plant the seed by speaking. All what you are praying for will first come as a "seed". The power is in the word and as the word is released, the seed is planted. All you have to do is to let it grow from within.

There are corruptible seeds and there are incorruptible seeds. Corruptible seeds are seeds that can fail. For example: when you plant corn, not every corn seed you plant will do well. This means that the seed of a corn is corruptible but, in the bible, according to (1st Peter 1:23 KJV), we see that the seed of God's word is incorruptible, and God's word never fails.

Now, the question you are probably asking is: "If God's word never fails, why haven't my finances, job, career, or health changed since I'm applying God's word?"

Why is there no change when you apply the word?

- 1. The soil dominates the seed: This means that the soil has the potential and power to limit what the seed can do. See Mark 4:3-9 for the parable of the sower. Here, the seed was sown and although the seed was incorruptible, it didn't bear fruits in all the ground they fell on.
- 2. The soil affects the seed: The soil is the "heart" of man, which means the core of man (spirit, emotions, mindset). What limits the word of God has to do with the things on the inside the mindset, emotions. For example: You may be praying for your husband, but your emotions have been broken/damaged. The condition of your heart, your belief system, begins to limit the power of the seed. What you need to do is to fix your heart the soil, because it limits the seed.

For example: You may be praying for your husband, but your emotions have been broken/damaged. The condition of your heart, your belief system, begins to limit the power of the seed. What you need to do is to fix your heart – the soil, because it limits the seed. Remember, when God's word is sown in your heart, you begin to see differently, because it will bear another kind of fruit.

Signs of a polluted heart.

For example, the moment the word "marriage" is mentioned, your heart is defiled. That's what you are praying for quite alright, but there is a negative way you feel about it and that shows faith is not present. Remember, the soil dominates the seed.

The reason why you don't have a testimony is because your heart is not fertile enough, your heart is negative. Therefore, when you are negative and you fast, pray, or sow, the outcome will be negative. The state of your heart should be good. The bible also says; "guard your heart with all diligence" (Proverbs 4:23 KIV)

What to do to actively take delivery of the Word

By Faith (Hebrews 4:2 KJV). Faith is how we take delivery of what grace has done. Where your faith stops, is where your testimony ends. (Hebrews 11 KJV)

Why Faith is so important?

·Faith is the ever-winning force (1st John 5:4 KJV)

When you have faith, you always get a good report (Hebrews 11:2 KJV)

·Faith has the power to shatter the attack of the enemy (Ephesians 6:16 KJV)

·You need to not just meditate on the word, you must act on it by faith. (James 1:22 KJV)

·The first step of faith is to believe (John 1:12) (Luke 1:45)

• Faith makes the impossible become possible. (See the story of Lazarus who was dead but faith brought him back to life and also the story of water turned into wine).

What do I do about my Faith?

Faith is not waiting on God to work; it is putting the word to work. It is not passive; it is putting the word of God to test.

Additional Scriptural References:

Mark 9:23 (NIV) - "Everything is possible for one who believes." Jesus reassures us that when we believe, there are no limits to what God can accomplish through us.

When we place our faith in Him, nothing will be impossible for us. So, don't underestimate the power of your faith. Dare to believe and watch as God moves mountains in your life.

THE GRACE FACTOR 1



And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work: 2 Corinthians 9:8 (KJV)

More than the success and wealth principles, Grace distinguishes people. When everything you know comes to an end, Grace takes over.

Grace is defined as the influence in the life of a man which is reflected in his everyday life giving him the supernatural ability to do exploits. It is the outworking of an inward influence. We have heard it said that grace is an unmerited favor. Is that really the full picture?

Grace is in dimensions. That is why our scripture for today, amongst others, talks about 'all grace'. There's a grace for accomplishments. The grace that qualifies you where and when you are not qualified. Doing the unusual as though it were usual. It is the ability of God in a man that causes him to achieve significant results.

There is a dimension of grace which is indeed unmerited favour. The grace for salvation is totally unmerited. It is freely given. It is solely based on the finished work of Jesus. Not requiring your contribution, only by the gift of faith through grace. God did not even allow the disciples to help Jesus bear the burden of the suffering for salvation by joining Him in prayers. They slept off each time they tried. It is solely God's doing from beginning to the end. No human effort in it.

Another dimension of grace is the grace for living a victorious Christian life every day **Eph 1:7**. It is also a grace that is freely given. This enables us to develop the fruits of the Spirit to live a godly lifestyle on earth. The Grace that teaches us to say 'No' to sin **Titus 1:12**. The way to appropriate the grace for forgiveness is to get the appropriate scriptures and meditate on it.

For example, the bible says we forgive as God in Christ has forgiven us **Ephesians 4:32**. The requirement to manifest this grace for forgiveness is to believe and speak it out of your mouth. As the faith of the new covenant is released by speaking **Rom 10:6**.

Grace delivers excellence. The Holy Spirit is the spirit of excellence. When the Spirit of God was upon King Solomon, he delivered so much excellence and wealth. Wealth is for kingdom influence. Tomorrow we will look at the other dimensions of grace.

THE GRACE FACTOR 2



But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you. 1 Peter 5:10, KJV

God is more interested in who you become more than what you want. More than the success and wealth principles, Grace distinguishes people.

Yesterday, we began to talk about the dimensions of grace. We looked at the grace for salvation which is totally freely given. We also saw the grace for living the Christian life which requires our confession.

Today, we look at yet another dimension of grace that requires your participation to come into full manifestation. Acts 4:33 calls this dimension Great Grace. It was made available to them to fulfill their purpose. The Apostles went forward, and they were backed with great power for great accomplishments. If the Apostles did not teach, there'll be nothing for signs and wonders to confirm (Acts 14:3). It is at this dimension of grace they began to manifest what Jesus says, 'Greater works will you do' (John 14:12). This required their full participation to accomplish. It is this grace that can be appropriated to fulfil this great prophecy of Jesus.

It is this dimension of Grace that delivers you into the fullness of your calling. This is what the Apostle Paul in **1 Cor 15:10** talks about labouring more abundantly on the grace that was bestowed upon him. In fact, he labours like no one else and has grace like no one else. He talks about grace upon grace which really means grace replacing the used grace. To increase in this grace, you must use up the previous grace. In **2 Pet 3:18**, the Amplified version translates grace as spiritual strength. Strength is only strength when it is used. Every grace given is to bring you to the fullness of your inheritance in Christ.

Various levels of grace are made available to us to bring us into the fullness of the likeness of God. Every time we use the available grace, we increase in grace. A new dimension is opened to us. There is a financial grace, which is best maximized through kingdom influence. Grace produces strength in not just the area that we worked on, but in areas of our weaknesses.

The Purpose of the Holy Spirit:

Joel 2:23, 28 (NIV) - "Be glad, people of Zion, rejoice in the Lord your God, for he has given you the autumn rains because he is faithful. He sends you abundant showers, both autumn and spring rains, as before.' 'And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions."

Practical Steps for Intimacy with the Holy Spirit:

- Cultivate a conscious awareness of God's presence. Become mindful of God in every aspect of your life, so you can recognize His voice and listen attentively when He speaks to you.

HOW DOES GOD GUIDE AND LEAD?



For as many as are led by the spirit of God, they are the sons of God. (Romans 8:14)

s we grow as believers, we need to recognize the leading of God in our lives. Everybody hears voices, but the question is who are you following? It is important to note that you cannot respond to God if you don't know how He leads you and also until you respond to God, you will not hear everything that God wants to tell you.

It is important for us as believers to understand God's leading, so we don't confuse it with our feelings. Recognition of God's leadings will make us separate His voice from the many voices around us.

Some ways through which God leads us:

- · Visual Methods: These come by sight either physical or spiritual. Examples are visions and dreams as relayed in **Job 33:14,15(KJV)** "For God speaketh once, yea twice, yet man perceiveth it not. In a dream in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falleth upon men, in slumberings upon the bed."
- · Supernatural Encounters: As seen in **Exodus 3:2(KJV)** "And the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush and he looked and behold the bush burned with fire and the bush was not consumed."
- · Audible Voices: These are clear voices that sound as normal voices, but they carry spiritual instructions as clearly stated in **Isaiah 30:21(KJV)** "And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee saying this is the way, walk ye in it when ye turn to the right hand and when ye turn to the left."
- · Another method of God's leading is categorized under Impressions: The Holy Spirit's inner witness makes us know about ourselves and things around us because The Holy Spirit is our perfect indicator. Some would call it intuition or sixth sense, but it is indeed the Holy Spirit.
- · Circumstances: These help confirm what God is saying and not necessarily inform. Things happen to us and around us that God uses to point us towards certain directions, and we can identify with our channel of spiritual guidance through; I) Knowledge of how God speaks II) How he has been speaking to you over time
- · The scriptures: This is the surest way by which God speaks, guides and leads us.

YOU ARE TOP CLASS



Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures. (*James 1:18*)

Observe the beginning of the construction in the opening verse; it says, "Of his own will begat He us...." That means the Lord gave birth to us on His own volition. It was His choice to give birth to us with the Word of truth that we should be a kind or a type of first fruit of His creatures! What's the meaning of first fruits? First fruit means the first and the best of anything; it implies top class. You're top class, excellent all the way, because you're born of God. Halleluiah!

The same truth is reiterated by the apostle Peter in (1 Peter 1:23): "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever." John also referenced the fact that this happened by God's own design; it was His will: "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name: Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12-13). It was His will to make you top-class.

So, live your best and be your best for Him. Keep your mind on the image of you that God has given you in His Word. You're His peculiar treasure, His reproduction, His excellent handiwork, a bundle of success, an achiever, and a victor in Christ Jesus. He made you for glory and beauty. See how He describes you in (Ephesians 2:10 AMPC): "For we are God's [own] handiwork (His workmanship), recreated in Christ Jesus, [born anew] that we may do those good works which God predestined (planned beforehand) for us [following paths which He prepared ahead of time], that we should walk in them [living the good life which He prearranged and made ready for us to live]."

Let this put a spring in your steps. It makes no difference who condemns you; refuse to be distracted by what others might be saying about you. What counts is who you are in Christ: you're top-class; perfected in righteousness, holy, unblameable and unreproveable in God's sight (Colossians 1:22). Glory to His Name forever!

My Father, help me always live in the consciousness of my identity as your excellent handiwork. (James 1:18).

I refuse to be distracted by the opinions of others and stand confidently in my position as your child. (Ephesians 2:10) In Jesus mighty name.

THE BENEFIT OF SERVICE



"And he sat down, and called the twelve, and saith unto them, If any man desires to be first, the same shall be last of all, and servant of all." (Mark 9:35)

God measures greatness by the ability to serve. Every time God wants us to serve, He's not really thinking about Himself because if He wants to get the job done, He can easily use angels. But when He calls a man to serve, He's thinking about the man.

God uses service to expand us. Every time God wants to expand a man, He calls Him to serve. God wanted to expand Moses, so He sent him to Pharaoh. Perhaps a demand to lead or evangelize has been placed upon you - you must see it as God's call to expand you.

Service expands your capacity.

In **Matthew 4:19**, Jesus said, "Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of men." This verse opens our eyes to see that there's something about serving and following that expands us from fishing for fish to becoming fishers of men - your capacity changes.

We all have potential, but what turns our potential into reality is service. There are things you'll never learn on your own and potentials you'll never know you have till you start serving. We see how Joshua continually waited on Moses as an assistant/servant until his capacity was expanded and he took over leading the people of Israel from Moses.

Another reason why God calls us to serve is because service turns your pain into power. Whether you're born again or not, pain is a constant in life because we live in a fallen world. God doesn't promise that we'll never have pain, instead, He says He'll give us comfort in our pain and turn our pain into a message. **2 Corinthians 1:3-4.**

How does God do this?

He depends on your service. If you can serve Him faithfully and use the pain you have gone through to serve/help others, He'll turn your mess into a message, your misery into ministry.

Service can fuel your success. It's a seed that carries words for the future. Hebrew 6:10 says, For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and do minister.

When it comes to service, it's possible not to be consistent because we can get weary. God understands, which is why He tells us in **1 Corinthians 15:58**, to be steadfast because our labour will not be in vain.

EFFECTIVE PRAYER



Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him. Fear the Lord, you his holy people, for those who fear him lack nothing. The lions may grow weak and hungry, but those who seek the Lord lack no good thing. (Psalm 34:8-10)

There is a lot to learn about this topic and a lot to unlearn, and one of the basic assumptions is that all prayers get results.

Many people prayed throughout the Bible, yet many of them did not have their prayers answered. The reasons could be wide because there are principles that guide prayers.

What is Prayer?

Prayer is word-based, you read the word to establish what God has done it. There are also moments when intense doubt prevents your prayers from being answered.

Why doesn't prayer work?

Thought pattern: Most people have mastered the religious acts of prayer i.e., praying to feel good or expressing your pain and it's not an active release of power. The heart is disconnected from the prayer. (Mathew 15:8)

You need to know what the will of God is: Every time you approach God and if you are not sure or certain if He'll do it or not you'll not receive. The problem with your prayer is that, you are not convinced God will do it for you. (Hebrews 11:6)

How to know God is willing:

Go to His word and allow His word speak to you on a personal level. Break up the fallow ground – your heart i.e. the thoughts, the mentality that is dry. (Hosea 10:12) See also: Psalm 51:17; Job 11:13

How to make your prayer powerful: You need to put in the work before you pray. Before you pray, you need to know what the will of God is. That God is willing to do this for me. (Psalm 34:8-10) Go to the word and find these scriptures. Put your heart in God's word by confessing it, and thinking about it, i.e., see yourself in your testimony.

One of the major hindrances to prayer is praying from a place of no confidence. (1st John 5:14). The posture of answered prayer is the posture of confidence in God's word.

Father, help me to pray from a place of confidence knowing that You're willing and able to do that which you have promised. Hebrews 11:6

My Father, My Father, I am so grateful that you hear me and you delight in granting me speedy response to my prayers according to your word. Isaiah 65:24

Father, I thank you because you are willing. You are able to do exceedingly, and abundantly and have made provisions for my goals. Ephesians 3:20

HOW TO ENJOY CONSTANT ANSWERS TO PRAYERS



"If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways."

(James 1:5 - 8)

Praying according to the Word gets the Father's attention because He only responds to the language of His Word. It is your guarantee to getting results. You can count on it! We need to grow in our understanding of the ways of God and learn to recognize the voice of God when He is speaking to us. This can be through His written Word, through His voice speaking into our spirit, or even through dreams and visions which was Daniel's experience.

Oftentimes, an unanswered prayer is not about God's unwillingness to respond, but with requests made from wrong motives or limited perspectives. When praying, let us keep three things in mind: First, we must make wise requests. When we ask according to God's will, we have confidence that He will answer our requests (1 John 5:14-15).

Second, we should examine our motives. (James 4:3).

Third, we should always trust God's perspective. Man sees glimpses only of the immediate future, but God can see everything at once. He's not slow about answering our petitions, because His timing is perfect (2 Peter 3:8-9)

Never give up on prayer, God is able to do much more than we can ever think or imagine. The secret of enjoying over 1000days of answered prayer on the altar of PPH is because we pray with the scriptures.


