Yes, that person that betrayed you, also the pain and deep hurt from the wrong someone did which is still so vivid in your memory. That's why you have the Holy Spirit, ask him for grace to forgive and let go. (Colossians 3:13)

Say this **CONFESSION** out loud, "I (say your name) forgive (say the name of the person/s that wronged you) for (say what was done).

To some who made this confession, I'm sure tears just rolled down your cheeks, that's a sign that you are liberated. As you keep making this confession, you would not just experience freedom from the bondage of unforgiveness but, you would also experience peace. This will give you access to God's mercy and forgiveness.

 2 Timothy 1:7 (KJV).

Confession: Father, I thank You that You have not given me nor my children the spirit of fear. Instead, by the blood of Jesus, we have a spirit of power, love and a sound mind.

- And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise **Philippians 4:8**. **Confession:** Father, I commit to focus on what is true, honorable, right, pure, lovely and admirable about my children. I won't dwell on anything but that which is excellent and worthy of praise where they are concerned.
- Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Philippians 4:6.

Confession: God, I trust You and I thank You for all you have done in my children's lives. I refuse to worry about my kids. Instead, I will pray and believe You will take care of them.

 What shall we say about such wonderful things as these? If God is for us, who can ever be against us? Romans 8:31

The faithful love of the Lord never ends! His mercies never cease. Great is his faithfulness; his mercies begin afresh each morning. Lamentations 3:22-23

When we bring our concerns to the Lord again and again, we can grow tired of waiting. We begin to feel like our prayers are falling on deaf ears, often our desire is to take control.

Waiting on God motivates us to look to Him. It casts our eyes rightly to Christ as the source of our faith and the assurance of our salvation. It reminds us that Christ's death and resurrection are the reason we can be filled and empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Trials cause us to persevere by deepening our knowledge of God and relying on Him more intentionally.

One of the key ingredients to receiving from God is the word, "patience." Few christians realize its importance! You need patience to be an overcomer. Jesus said, "In your patience possess ye your souls" **Luke 21:19**. Some things don't happen overnight, and it takes patience to get there.

Our spoken words during the period of waiting are a show of patience or lack of it. We know of the story of Daniel's waiting in **Daniel 10**. In **verse 12**, the angel that brought his answered prayer told him, "I have come because of your words". **Proverbs 18:20** says "A man's stomach shall be satisfied from the fruit of his mouth".

Stand firm then. Note that the word "stand" is repeated three times. In standing, shed all confidence in man including self, don't be afraid for your weakness to show, so His power can be made perfect **2 Cor 12:8-9.** Continue to stand firm in Christ and live fully for him, trusting in His perfect will despite any present difficulties.

No matter what you're going through, having done the will of God, you need patience to obtain the promise. For your patience allows God to perfect all that concerns the promise. So, relax in Christ, stand, have patience and faith in God, and you will obtain the promise.

THE SPIRIT OF FAITH



Jesus said, Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he hath been dead four days. John 11:39 (KJV)

The fact that your prayers were not answered the way you expected does not mean that God has forgotten your prayers.

In **John 11**, the uniqueness of Jesus' relationship with the family of Lazarus and his sisters, Mary and Martha, was elucidated. Jesus loved them and they knew and leaned on to Jesus' love for them. Despite this loving relationship, they called out to Jesus when they needed healing for their sick brother, Lazarus, but Jesus delayed for 2 days (John 11:5-6). Finally, Lazarus died and was buried.

Four days after Lazarus was buried, Jesus shows up and asks that the stone covering the tomb be removed. The stone represents things that hinder you from believing in miracles. It could be hopelessness and despair, would you still believe in that promotion you have been praying for, after the promotion list has come out? Jesus would not raise Lazarus if they would not remove the stone. Jesus could remove the stone, but He would not. He needs your belief to give you your miracle.

The stone could be mindsets. Mary and Martha had conceived in their mind the way Jesus should answer their prayer. They had envisaged that Jesus would heal Lazarus. Are you in a situation where though you know Jesus loves you, you do not see Him come to your rescue the way you envisage? Jesus has a greater glory in store for you as He did in the life of Lazarus.

Naaman had a mindset on how he would get his miracle. A filthy small river Jordan was not in his agenda such that he nearly missed his miracle. Peter was a seasoned fisherman, he knew the waves well. At the sight of the storm, he returned to the knowledge of the waves. The question really is, if the sea was still with no ripples, could he still have walked on the water?

Another, is one's thoughts. The bible says to take no thought saying... **Matt 6:31**. The words we speak start from the heart before it becomes words. Thoughts create pathways that could limit faith and give the devil a place **Eph 4:27**.

Create abundance pathways. Move from "just enough" thinking to "abundant" thinking. When you acknowledge you have, you get more **Matt 13:12**. Identify what is feeding you. For example, think of recession as working for you and not against you.

Please see scriptures to affirm and create a pathway of victory for your mind and develop the mind of Christ. **Job 22:29b**; **Psalm 68:19**; **Jeremiah 30:19**; **Matthew 6:31-33**; **Psalm 37:26**; **3:9**; **Proverb 11:24**.

THE IMPARTATION OF FAITH



God gave Jesus to die for our sins, and He raised Him to life, so that we would be made acceptable to God. By faith we have been made acceptable to God. And now, thanks to our Lord Jesus Christ, we have peace with God. Rom 4:25 - 5:1 (CEV)

The resurrection of Jesus from death is proof that the penalty for sin was sufficient and fully accepted by the Father.

People can be put to death for 3 different reasons:

- · For their own sins
- · As martyrs for their belief
- · Substitutional (in place of another)

Jesus' death was that of a substitutional death since He had no sin of his own to die for. Peter says He DID no sin **1 Peter 2:22**, Paul says He HAD no sin **2 Cor 5:21** and John declares that IN Him is no sin **1 John 3:5**. Spirit, soul, and body, sin could not be found, yet He was punished and died for sin.

In our text today, God gave Jesus to die for our transgressions. This death was first the separation between God the Father and God the Son on the cross. On Jesus, placed all the sins of the world. so, Jesus was separated from the Father and called Him for the first time, God (Elohim – creator God) why have you forsaken me **Mark 15:34**. Jesus was abandoned because of your sin, you can no longer be abandoned.

The law of double jeopardy says that, you cannot be punished twice for the same sin. Jesus already took the punishment for your sin; God can no longer punish you for it. In fact, **Rom 5:1** says we now have peace, no broken relationship, with God because of this. This is the source of our peace and boldness. The enemy can, however, lie to you and deceive you to believe that God is still punishing you for it—that is the roaring of the devil.

Believe and receive this work of Grace by faith. Enter the place of prayer knowing that there is NO BARRIER between you and God. Affirm it to convince your mind, not convince God or even your spirit. As soon as your mind catches on, manifestations in the physical will come very swiftly.

THE APPLICATION OF FAITH



The lazy person claims, "There's a lion out there! If I go outside, I might be killed" Prov 22:13 (NLT)

There is and will always be challenges at every stage of life. Abandoning them is not a solution. Let us look at the effective ways of holding on and fighting to the end.

From our text we determine the biblical definition of laziness as seeing problems or challenges and avoiding them.

The bible says the devil goes about LIKE a lion, seeking whom he may devour **1 Peter 5:8**. You see, he only imitates, impersonates the lion. He is not the lion. On the other hand, Jesus is clearly called the Lion of the tribe of Judah **Rev 5:5**. How then is this us? Are we now Jesus? In **1 John 4:17b**, John the beloved says, 'As Jesus is, so are we in this world'. Jesus is still the Lion, so are we right now, in this world. Therefore, we do not turn away from any beast.

How can I hold on against the onslaught of the enemy?

- 1. The fight is not about you. In **1 Sam 17**, David was sent with supply to the battle front for his brothers. In **verse 29**, David's response to Eliab, his brother, who came against him was 'Is there not a cause?' There is a superior cause beyond you for the challenges you face in life. David saw a greater cause than himself and faced Goliath while Eliab left the greater cause and began to fight with David. See your success as a motivation for your children to succeed. Think of the generational impact.
- 2. The fight is to advance the Kingdom. David had a heart for the Kingdom of God. He saw the molestation by the words of Goliath as not just against the armies of Israel but against the God of the armies of Israel. So, he went into battle 'that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel' **1 Sam 17:46b**.

Pray for passion for the expansion of the Kingdom. When you see your success over the challenges of life as beyond you and for the kingdom, there's a guarantee of success because it is born of God, it will overcome the world **1 John 5:4**. Think about how you could glorify God in areas such as sex trafficking, child pornography, and prostitution.

How can the earth know Jesus through your business and career?

THE GRACE FACTOR 1



And God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work: 2 Corinthians 9:8 (KJV)

More than the success and wealth principles, Grace distinguishes people. When everything you know comes to an end, Grace takes over.

Grace is defined as the influence in the life of a man which is reflected in his everyday life giving him the supernatural ability to do exploits. It is the outworking of an inward influence. We have heard it said that grace is an unmerited favor. Is that really the full picture?

Grace is in dimensions. That is why our scripture for today, amongst others, talks about 'all grace'. There's a grace for accomplishments. The grace that qualifies you where and when you are not qualified. Doing the unusual as though it were usual. It is the ability of God in a man that causes him to achieve significant results.

There is a dimension of grace which is indeed unmerited favour. The grace for salvation is totally unmerited. It is freely given. It is solely based on the finished work of Jesus. Not requiring your contribution, only by the gift of faith through grace. God did not even allow the disciples to help Jesus bear the burden of the suffering for salvation by joining Him in prayers. They slept off each time they tried. It is solely God's doing from beginning to the end. No human effort in it.

Another dimension of grace is the grace for living a victorious Christian life every day **Eph 1:7**. It is also a grace that is freely given. This enables us to develop the fruits of the Spirit to live a godly lifestyle on earth. The Grace that teaches us to say 'No' to sin **Titus 1:12**. The way to appropriate the grace for forgiveness is to get the appropriate scriptures and meditate on it.

For example, the bible says we forgive as God in Christ has forgiven us **Ephesians 4:32**. The requirement to manifest this grace for forgiveness is to believe and speak it out of your mouth. As the faith of the new covenant is released by speaking **Rom 10:6**.

Grace delivers excellence. The Holy Spirit is the spirit of excellence. When the Spirit of God was upon King Solomon, he delivered so much excellence and wealth. Wealth is for kingdom influence. Tomorrow we will look at the other dimensions of grace.

THE GRACE FACTOR 2



But the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after that ye have suffered a while, make you perfect, stablish, strengthen, settle you. 1 Peter 5:10, KJV

God is more interested in who you become more than what you want. More than the success and wealth principles, Grace distinguishes people.

Yesterday, we began to talk about the dimensions of grace. We looked at the grace for salvation which is totally freely given. We also saw the grace for living the Christian life which requires our confession.

Today, we look at yet another dimension of grace that requires your participation to come into full manifestation. Acts 4:33 calls this dimension Great Grace. It was made available to them to fulfill their purpose. The Apostles went forward, and they were backed with great power for great accomplishments. If the Apostles did not teach, there'll be nothing for signs and wonders to confirm (Acts 14:3). It is at this dimension of grace they began to manifest what Jesus says, 'Greater works will you do' (John 14:12). This required their full participation to accomplish. It is this grace that can be appropriated to fulfil this great prophecy of Jesus.

It is this dimension of Grace that delivers you into the fullness of your calling. This is what the Apostle Paul in **1 Cor 15:10** talks about labouring more abundantly on the grace that was bestowed upon him. In fact, he labours like no one else and has grace like no one else. He talks about grace upon grace which really means grace replacing the used grace. To increase in this grace, you must use up the previous grace. In **2 Pet 3:18**, the Amplified version translates grace as spiritual strength. Strength is only strength when it is used. Every grace given is to bring you to the fullness of your inheritance in Christ.

Various levels of grace are made available to us to bring us into the fullness of the likeness of God. Every time we use the available grace, we increase in grace. A new dimension is opened to us. There is a financial grace, which is best maximized through kingdom influence. Grace produces strength in not just the area that we worked on, but in areas of our weaknesses.

As Christians we all face different levels of intensity when it comes to challenges and pain. It is crucial for us to be sensitive to the struggles of others and not trivialize their experiences. The Holy Spirit is our source of help, but if we don't know how to receive it, we may miss out on its transformative power.

Life is filled with tough situations, and it is a natural part of the human process to encounter them. However, as believers, we must remember that God has a purpose in every circumstance. Even when we are going through difficult times, if we hold on to our faith, we will come out with a testimony. The goodness of God does not depend on the outcome of our situations; He is our ever-present help in times of trouble.

The gift of the Holy Spirit is God's help to His children. It contains various gifts such as the word of knowledge, the gift of prophecy, discernment of spirit, and the gift of faith. God helps us by giving us the Holy Spirit, who provides us with these gifts to navigate through challenging situations. There are problems that logic alone cannot solve, but with the Holy Spirit's wisdom and guidance, we can find the solutions we need.

Sometimes, situations in our lives do not change until power moves on our behalf. It takes divine power to change our circumstances, and while we may not always see the power itself, we can witness the results it produces. As Christians, we have the authority to move situations in our lives from lack to abundance, from despair to hope. In **2 Kings 6:8-12**, we see how Elisha was able to advise the king on strategic war plans because of the special knowledge provided by the Holy Spirit.

So, what does the gift of the Holy Spirit do? Firstly, it deepens our conviction in Christ. As mentioned in **1 Corinthians 2:4**, the Holy Spirit enables us to boldly proclaim our stand in Christ. Secondly, the Holy Spirit helps convince others of the power of God. In **1 Corinthians 14:24-25**, we see how the Spirit's manifestation can touch hearts and bring others to a place of belief and surrender.

HOW TO OBSERVE GODS PATTERN IN OUR LIVES



John 5: 2-4 (KJV)

One of the biggest assets of every child of God is hearing the voice of God.

As a Christian, it's important to understand how God speaks to you. Living without knowing the voice of God is like living in a danger zone.

What is the Importance of Recognition?

The way spiritual things work, you must first recognize them, in order to receive them. What does a pattern mean? A pattern is a combination of qualities, and tendencies forming a consistent arrangement.

Why is it Important to Recognize the Patterns of God in Our Lives?

From person to person the pattern of God is different. The pattern of God refers to the method, and the arrangement in which God deals with us, relates with us, intervenes in our life and does miracles.

Observing the pattern of God at work in your life is one of the things you must do as a Christian. When you read about Elijah and Elisha's ministries, you will see that the power of God moved through "Mantles". The mantle was a pattern here, but in Moses' ministry, the power of God did not move through mantles, but through a "Rod".

Why is it Important to Understand Patterns?

- To avoid frustration: It's important to understand the pattern of guidance so you can avoid frustration. For some, the way God speaks is through dreams, while for others, it could be through visions. Also, if you don't understand the pattern of God in your life, you will think that there is a delay, meanwhile it is a process. Understanding the patterns of God in your life will help you determine whether or not there is a delay. (Genesis 50:20 KJV) (John 12:24 KJV)
- **To avoid missing our visitations**: Recognizing the pattern of God helps us not to miss God's visitation.
- · To be able to initiate it: Once you understand patterns you can initiate it.

In summary, as a Christian, it's important to understand how God speaks to you. Living without knowing the voice of God is like living in a danger zone.

Whatever you believe God is speaking to you about, pray and worship God about it; if it is what God wants, it grows stronger and stronger; if it is the devil's voice, it grows weaker and weaker.

"Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant". This means that if you are ignorant, you will be unable to receive what the Spirit of God is doing. 1st Corinthians 12:1 (KJV)

Now, look at the breakthroughs you have had in your life. They could have been in your career, job, health, marriage or finance. Did you notice that the breakthrough started with pain and discomfort? This is because they are the raw material for the miraculous.

If you understand that your breakthrough started with pain and discomfort, why do you break down? You break down because you have not observed the pattern. **John 12:24 (KJV)**

A) Patterns of Provision:

i. God doesn't multiply nothing; He will multiply what you have, therefore something must be available. **2nd Corinthians 9:10**.

See also the story of the woman that was in debt. Elisha asked her what she had. **2nd King 4:1-7**

B) Patterns of Demonic attack:

i. Ignorance. 1st Corinthians 2:11

Everywhere there is ignorance, Satan takes advantage of people.

ii. Confusion James 3:16

iii. Evil communication **1st Corinthians 15:33**. You start to hear and utter negative things.

iv. Fear. Note: You gravitate towards what you fear, hence you should find a way to sink your fear.

C) Patterns of Breakthrough:

i. Pain and discomfort: When you are going to break through, you will discover that you are in discomfort and pain. God requires that discomfort to push you towards destiny, because if you don't feel it, you won't be pushed. **John 12:24**

ii. Failed pursuit attempts

Here, you'll notice that you experience failed attempts to prosper. Even when you work hard, it doesn't work. You may believe that your efforts are futile, but you are getting closer to it.

What you need to do is to go into thanksgiving. Remember Mark 4:28 (KJV), "...first the blade, then the ear, after that the full corn in the ear"

iii. New insights will come to you: You'll have new perspectives on things that you didn't have before. It could be through conversations etc.

D) Patterns of Marriage:

i) Random acts of kindness: From Rebecca to Ruth. God used their kindness to mysteriously bring them their spouse. God led them to strategic relationships that was essential to their marriage. For example, Rebecca's feeding of the servant and animal linked her to her husband, Isaac.

E) Patterns of Guidance:

i. God's guidance comes with peace.

ii. Guidance comes to those that recognize it. To become familiar with the voice of God, pay attention to the voice that interprets scriptures to you.

iii. Emotions, fear, desire, lust can distort guidance. You may never hear what God is saying when your emotions are intense about something.

How to have guidance:

1)Pay attention to gateways. It could be through a conversation with a friend and through that conversation, God could speak to you.

It's important to ask yourself if you're able to deduce the workings of God and recognize/understand the patterns of Grace in my life?

*My Father, My Father! I receive clarity to recognize the patterns of God in my life. **Ephesians 1:17-18**

Confessions:

- *I receive capacity to discern the leading of the holy spirit in my life.
- *I continue to walk in obedience to the will of God to enable me bond intimately with Christ though the help of the spirit.



PRIESTHOOD MENTALITY



And have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they are ruling on the earth. Revelation 5:10 (BBE)

Every believer is a priest regardless of his or her full-time occupation.

God ordained the children of Israel as a nation of priests as early as immediately they left Egypt (Ex 19:6). In our text today, John the Beloved in Revelation confidently declared we have conquered as priests. Let us look at how to keep our mentality in the reality of our Priesthood.

Priests are always in God's presence. Priests enjoy continued fellowship with God. Looking at the priests of the Old Testament, they were the ones who had encounters with God. They had access to the most holy place, but Praise God, Jesus by His shed blood has torn the veil from top to bottom. We can now freely come to Him, and fellowship without condemnation.

Priests are set apart. They are God's special people chosen to show forth His Glory. Remember the three disciples, Peter, James and John, they were the closest to Jesus while He was on earth. They were and still are the only humans on earth who ever saw Jesus in His full glory.

How then do we acquire this priesthood mindset? Like the donkey that Jesus rode on into Jerusalem in **Luke 19:30**, Jesus required a donkey on which no burden has been laid. The first thing is not to be encumbered by the cares of this world. God must be your main agenda. The Bible says, seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness (**Matt 6:33**).

Secondly, get loose. Are you already entangled by so much burden and care? Get loose. If you are not loose, you cannot be used by God. God will not struggle with man (**Gen 6:3**). The altar is the place where desires die. Priesthood is about the dictates of God (**1 Pet 2:9**). Priests are made for God. Our will is nothing compared to His will.

Thirdly, submit it to Jesus. You do not pray out the flesh, you submit it (**Gal 5:17**). Do not make provisions to accommodate the desires of the flesh. Leave it all to Jesus.

The priesthood mindset will enable you kill the appetite of the flesh. The Lord, Himself, is the inheritance of the priest. When everything else fails, the inheritance of the priest never fails. In the highs and in the lows, your inheritance is assured.

Jesus spoke to the people once more and said, "I am the light of the world. If you follow me, you won't have to walk in darkness, because you will have the light that leads to life." John 8:12(NLT)

DISCERNING THE VOICE OF GOD

Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, neither was the word of the LORD yet revealed unto him. And the LORD called Samuel again the third time. And he arose and went to Eli, and said, here am I; for thou didst call me. And Eli perceived that the LORD had called the child.

Therefore, Eli said unto Samuel, Go, lie down: and it shall be, if he call thee, that thou shalt say, Speak, LORD; for thy servant heareth. So, Samuel went and lay down in his place. And the LORD came, and stood, and called as at other times, Samuel, Samuel.

Then Samuel answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth.

(1st Samuel 3:6 - 10)

One of the most important and yet illusive concepts in Christianity is the ability to discern God's voice. Many Christians today are very confused when it comes to discerning God's voice. Because God is spiritual and rarely communicates with us through our physical senses, most of our interactions with God is based on our ability to discern Him spiritually. This makes it difficult for us who have always relied on our physical senses to discern our environment. (John 10:27)

We have a God that wants to be known and has made it very easy for us to discern His voice. There is a saying that goes "start from the known to the unknown", God has done just that. Since we rely primarily on our physical senses, God has put everything thing that we need to know about him in his Word (The Bible). God expects us to start by reading His word and becoming familiar with his person and character, so that when He begins to speak, we will begin to understand how he speaks, the content of what He will say and what He will never say. We can be sure that God will never say anything that contradicts His word, so the more you are familiar with the Word, the more you will be able to discern God's Voice. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

There are other ways to discern God's voice, and that is fellowship with people, people who are now more experienced in discerning God's voice. Notice in the opening scripture that Eli taught Samuel how to recognize and respond to the voice of God, without Eli, Samuel probably would have missed the opportunity to recognize God's voice and to respond to it.

God wants to speak to us and we must be very confident in this. But God's voice must be discerned spiritually and this can be done by studying his Word and in fellowship with other believers.

Remember, life can sometimes be overwhelming, but with the Holy Spirit's power within you, you'll have an uncommon joy that sets you apart. Surround yourself with people who encourage your faith and stay committed to God. Let the Holy Spirit be your constant companion, and you'll discover a joy that goes beyond anything you've experienced before.

Without any doubt, many of us have struggled with, or are still battling with, self-doubt or low self-esteem. It is one of the biggest attacks on Christians. Some of the issues that affect your Christianity could include selfdoubt and low self-esteem. Hence you are unable to fulfil your potential. The first example of self-doubt in the bible occurred when Eve was convinced to eat the apple from the tree and she was assured by the devil that if she did, "...you will be like God" Genesis 3:5 (NIV). He made her doubt herself when she was already God-like.

What does self-doubt look like?

- 1. When you have self-doubt, one of the things you notice is that you procrastinate a lot because you're afraid. A question to ask yourself: "What are you meant to do this year that you have pushed because of self-doubt?"
- 2. Self-doubt does not allow the authentic you to come out, that is, it prevents the genuine you from emerging; instead, it keeps limiting you. A question to ask yourself: "Are you in a race to either look like somebody else or talk like somebody else?
- 3. When you have self-doubt, you always pretend to be who you are not in order for people to accept you.
- 4. When you have self-doubt, you are constantly hiding who you are because you don't want people to see who you are.

What lie is the devil telling you?

Remember, the lies corrupt the thoughts and the thought makes you lose your passion. The problem is that you believe a lie, which is that you must behave in a specific way in order to be perfect or do well.

What you need to do is not become another person. What you need to do is become the best version of yourself. In conclusion, it is important to move from a place of self-doubt to self-belief. The simple change could be you just believing in yourself.

Do you see yourself as blessed or as a hustler? Your financial mindset will determine your behaviour, your behaviour will determine your action and your action will determine your result. One major way God changes our belief system is through revelation and it is also important to note that your association determines your language. When your life wants to change, God brings you relationships that raise your standard.

Relationships that stretch us are good for our growth and development rather than the ones that just accommodate us. When God wants to change us, He brings us to places and people that challenges our thinking and language. He also begins to throw financial weight at us by suggesting to us financial projects and assignments. When God throws weight at you, He wants to build your financial muscle and you don't build financial muscle by talking but by carrying weight.

You must also be careful not to do what God is calling you to do in the flesh, that is using man's effort to carry God's weight which will in turn produce an Ishmael. Ishmael is a typology of man's initiative to produce what The Spirit wants to do. Isaac is when The Spirit works through you to produce what God wants to do. That is why God allows people to disappoint you so that you can walk through The Spirit to develop muscles. The weight God puts on you might be initially inconvenient till you've mastered it and then He adds another weight to stretch you because you are the light of the world and if you are the light of the world, you will have global problems that you will need the spiritual muscles you've built over time to bring the global solutions.

The question is what mindset is God challenging you to change that you're holding onto? Where is God calling you to grow the capacity that fear is holding you back from? We must never forget the place of Grace in this and Grace comes as a weight or demand because it determines the engine that drives everything.

OVERCOMING THE FEAR OF FAILURE



"But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him." 1 Corinthians 2:9 (KJV)

Our inheritance is fully prepared, paid for by the finished work and delivered to us. (2 Peter 1:3) One of God's greatest blessings is putting these prepared things in our hearts by the Holy Spirit. God puts these inheritances (ideas) as flash thoughts.

Fear casts shadow over our lives and prevents us from living the full abundant life God intends for us. It limits potential (**Judges 6:13**); incapacitates and causes bondage (**Romans 8:15**); fear involves torment (**1 John 4:18**). Some of the causes of fear are not believing God is as good as He says He is, not relying on God's wisdom, and trying to understand these God-given ideas before we step out.

How to Overcome Fear

The good news is that God knows about our nature to fear and He, in His grace and mercy, made a way for us. Seek God (**Psalm 34:4**) – set your mind and heart on God and His nature. Realize God is with you. He never leaves you nor forsakes you.

Feed faith (**Rom 10:17**) – Feeding faith starves fear. Faith is fed by hearing the word according to the context of this scripture (**Rom 10:14-17**). Listen to the proclamation of the word of God to build faith.

Fear the Lord (**Proverbs 1:7**) – Wisdom is gained through the reverence of the Lord and provides a channel into the mind of Christ. We see God's perspective and can obey quickly.

God's love (1 John 4:18) – The perfect love is the love of God and it casts out ALL fears. Be filled with the love of God. The love of God is shed in our hearts by the Holy Spirit (Rom 5:5).

To overcome fear, we must develop an intimate relationship with the Holy Spirit. We are the sheep of His pasture and His sheep knows His voice, the voice of the stranger it will not heed (**John 10:5**). Believe this and exercise the righteousness of faith which speaks.

Service expands your capacity.

In **Matthew 4:19**, Jesus said, "Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of men." This verse opens our eyes to see that there's something about serving and following that expands us from fishing for fish to becoming fishers of men - your capacity changes.

We all have potential, but what turns our potential into reality is service. There are things you'll never learn on your own and potentials you'll never know you have till you start serving. We see how Joshua continually waited on Moses as an assistant/servant until his capacity was expanded and he took over leading the people of Israel from Moses.

Another reason why God calls us to serve is because service turns your pain into power. Whether you're born again or not, pain is a constant in life because we live in a fallen world. God doesn't promise that we'll never have pain, instead, He says He'll give us comfort in our pain and turn our pain into a message. **2 Corinthians 1:3-4.**

How does God do this?

He depends on your service. If you can serve Him faithfully and use the pain you have gone through to serve/help others, He'll turn your mess into a message, your misery into ministry.

Service can fuel your success. It's a seed that carries words for the future. Hebrew 6:10 says, For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and do minister.

When it comes to service, it's possible not to be consistent because we can get weary. God understands, which is why He tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:58, to be steadfast because our labour will not be in vain.
